

Team Alberta – Gold Medal Performance

Clean Sweep at the 2026 Canadian Masters Team Championships!



Team Alberta claimed the GOLD MEDAL at the 2026 Canadian Masters Teams Championships in Montreal for the first time in seventeen years. After 3 consecutive years of finishing third behind Ontario and Quebec this marks a historic and unforgettable achievement for Team Alberta. The tournament was one the team will remember for years to come, both for the results on court and the camaraderie built throughout the week.

Friday and Saturday matches resulted in convincing wins over Team Quebec B and Manitoba earning Team Alberta the top seed position in the Championship Pool with Ontario and Quebec A. After a dominating victory over Team Ontario on Saturday afternoon, the table was set for an epic Sunday match up versus Quebec A.

Team Alberta's first victory of the event came off the court, during the highly anticipated and stress inducing Team Skit Competition at the Saturday Night Team Banquet. For the first time in the history of the skit competition, Team Alberta was awarded the coveted Neddy Award for an unforgettable and hilarious Synchronized Swimming Skit—a production that involved countless laughs, hours of team rehearsal, last minute music compilations, prop innovations, preparations and a multitude of choreography iterations. With the judges and crowd in tears and a standing ovation of cheers, the tone was set for a clean sweep for Team Alberta.



On Sunday at noon, Team Alberta took to the courts against Quebec A one match down. (Alex, who had battled through an ankle injury to secure a crucial win in Saturday's Ontario match, was unable to compete in the final.) Despite starting the final encounter with the handicap, needing to win 4 of the 6 matches to secure the Gold, Team Alberta rose to the challenge. The men faced tough battles, with Michael pulling out a key victory to remain undefeated throughout the 2026 Masters. All three women remained undefeated, securing three critical wins for Alberta and the 4 to 3 victory over team Quebec A.





The final match of the day delivered a thrilling five-game showdown. After the back and forth fifth game became tied at 9-9 the tension behind and on court was palpable. Kelsey steadied herself for the final push taking an 11-9 victory to seal the Gold Medal for Team Alberta. Alex remained on the bench throughout the final, coaching and cheering on his teammates as Team Alberta fought for every point to bring the 2026 Canadian Masters Team Championships title back to Alberta for the first time since 2009 (when it was hosted by the Bow Valley Club).

The 2026 Canadian Masters Team Championship brought together top Masters Players from across the country, and it was an honour for Team Alberta to represent Squash Alberta on the national stage. New friendships were formed and lasting memories were made.



Squash Alberta is looking forward to bringing the same energy and spirit to Calgary when the 2027 Canadian Masters Teams Championships will be hosted at the Bow Valley Athletic Club.
